GOOD NEIGHBOUR Covid-19 Response

NEPAL

epal has recorded almost 980,000 COVID-19 cases and 12,000 deaths from COVID; many more cases and deaths have gone unrecorded.

Good Neighbour (Asal Chhimekee) Nepal (ACN) serves vulnerable people who have been highly impacted by COVID lockdowns and the pandemic itself. The main focus of their COVID response are people dependent on daily wages who lost their income source, people living with disabilities, single mothers and seniors. ACN provides these people with health awareness and promotion, advice on caring for a COVID-positive person at home, counselling, and packs of essential food, hygiene and other supplies. They also introduce specific programs developed for the COVID response in our usual working areas.



Covid awareness training

COVID-19 Rapid Response, implemented in three districts, provided 562 households with food, health and hygiene supplies. Ten health and isolation centres were provided with emergency medical supplies and essential equipment to give immediate care for COVID infected people.

Health Materials and Relief Support Project

was implemented in two districts, with five-hundred households provided with relief supplies. Four health and isolation centres were supplied with emergency

medical items and equipment. Students were supported to continue studies at home during lockdowns, and children were engaged in various activities. Online competitions were organised to combat boredom and winners were invited to present their talent and receive prizes. Youth were

provided with vocational

trainings such as hospitality management and beautician training to earn sustainable income.

COVID-19 Response and Recovery Project was implemented in four districts with the aim of quicker recovery from the impacts of COVID. Mass awareness programs were conducted over radio and in-person presentations. Two hundred and forty-six families received income-generating training. Five hundred and ten students at community schools were provided with school supplies, uniforms, and health and hygiene kits. Six health posts received

emergency medical supplies and 104 households received food and non-food supplies.

A Khoji toll-free helpline: Midway through the pandemic, ACN set up a help centre with a toll-free

> number for people to call for assistance in emergency cases. A help centre attendee received calls and assisted the caller to access the specific support needed. The team visited many COVID infected individuals, providing health support, counselling, advice, advocacy, food, basic

medicine, arranging

ambulance services and physical and networking support as per the client's need.

Thousands of lives have been positively impacted through the dedication of ACN staff who remain committed to serving and caring for the most vulnerable, despite personal risk, and through technical and financial support from advisers, donors, local and overseas individuals,.

SAVAR **SCHOOL TO** SECURE A PERMANENT HOME

BANGLADESH

ur school in Savar, Bangladesh, spans Kindergarten to Year 10, with 120 students enrolled. The school has been running for 15 years on a rented site. Despite all schools

being closed for 18

months due to COVID-19, we continued to pay our teachers as their families relied on their salaries. Our school teaches the full national curriculum and has significantly exceeded the national average consistently in examination results.





LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

The school is well regarded in the area and the local government officials routinely

come to lend their support at major school events.

The provision of quality education to all in the the communities that the Caleb Foundation for South Asia serves through the New Hope Ministries

Bangladesh Trust (NHMBT) is integral to our work in Bangladesh. On our regular visits to the school, we are encouraged by the warmth and enthusiasm of the students, parents, and staff.

A GENEROUS OFFER

In recognition of the NHMBT's commitment to education in the Savar community, the owner of the property offered the Trust the opportunity to purchase the site at a quarter of the current market value and for the amount to be paid over three years interest free.

He is keen to see Years 11 and 12 (college years) added to our school. The purchase of this site is critical, as it protects against rental increases in the long-term.



Rents have been high in recent years, but we currently have a very favourable rental price for the property. This offer also avoids the potential of a costly relocation should the property be sold, and most importantly the Trust believes our school will be self-sufficient financially by the end of 2023. The property will cost \$AU70,000.

ENTERPRISING TEACHERS

Through their own initiative, the teachers have developed a plan to further increase the number of enrolments, thereby expanding our school's service to their community.

PROJECT LAUNCHED

In March this year, we

launched a project through Н A D (NHMBT Savar **School Property** Purchase Project) to take up this strategic offer to secure the school's future. This vital project is only possible through the wonderful

support of HADA and your generosity.

SERGELT OOD: ASSISTING THOSE WHO ARE HOMELESS

MONGOLIA

arm greetings from Mongolia! We are in the middle of the hot summer season and a lot is happening.

Our drop-in bus activities to the homeless people of Ulaanbaatar are going well. Several of our



contacts are receiving hospital assistance. Since it's summer, only very few people take the step into an addiction care centre. As soon as temperatures drop to freezing, more will take that step, some initially to survive the winter, others to drastically work on changing their lives.

This month we had our summer outings to the river with our homeless contacts. The weather was great, and

everybody enjoyed the day with new clothes and haircuts. We played games, sang songs and former homeless addicts shared inspiring testimonies of how their lives had changed, and the party was completed with a big fat sheep for lunch.

As the warm season is only short, the opportunity is taken to improve outdoor spaces. A

big part of our fence has been replaced and the street behind our building extended: two big *gers* (portable, circular dwellings) are in the making.

One big 12-wall ger will serve as our coffee shop and eatery (our first small business project!) where

former homeless participants in our community house can choose to work. Around the ger will be a small wooden-fenced garden.

The other seven-wall ger is being made for staff overseeing the community house — or for guests to use.

The work is going well, and we can't wait to see the results. We're very grateful for the donors who have helped make this possible.



After the summer a new team is be formed: currently we're having interviews with candidates. It is a big challenge to find and keep local staff that serve wholeheartedly, responsibly and committed for the long-term.
